
# REVERSIBLE PLACEMATS

## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 44" wide.

Makes four placemats.

	Fabric	Yardage
Placemat front	А	1 yard
Placemat backing	В	1 yard
Placemat binding	С	5/8 yard

You will also need: Four pieces of batting or fusible fleece, each 22" x 16"

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 44" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

two 15" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 21" x 15" rectangles

#### From Fabric B, cut:


two 16" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 22" x 16" backing pieces

### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## **Assembly Instructions**

**Step 1:** Layer the backing, batting (or fusible fleece) and placemat front on a work surface, with the wrong sides of the fabric facing the batting. Center all three layers. Baste in place and quilt as desired.



Note: If using Fusible Fleece, fuse prior to basting, following the manufacturer's instructions.

Step 2: Trim to 20" x 14". Sew two binding strips together, then bind the placemat.

**Step 3:** Repeat Steps 1-2 to make four placemats.

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
