Fabric and Supplies Needed

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 34-1/2" x 41-1/2" rectangle

From Fabric B, cut:

two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 4-1/2" x 17-1/2" rectangles

two 4-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

five 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixty-four 2-7/8" squares

ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:

two 2-1/2" x 55-1/2" side outer borders

two 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

two 2-1/2" x 43-1/2" side middle borders

two 2-1/2" x 43-1/2" top/bottom middle borders

From Fabric C, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 5-1/4" squares

From each of Fabrics D,E, and G, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 5-1/4" squares of each fabric

From Fabric F, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 5-1/4" squares

four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" side inner borders

two 1-1/2" x 36-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Flying Geese (FG)

Step 1: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric B squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric C square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.



Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



Step 4: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric B square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 5: Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make sixteen B/C FG units.



Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 2-7/8" Fabric B squares and 5-1/4" Fabric D-G squares to make a total of:









Assemble the Flying Geese (FG)

Step 7: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 8: Sew the side middle borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom middle borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Sew three B/C FG, three B/D FG, three B/E FG, three B/F FG, three B/G FG, and one 4-1/2" x 17-1/2" Fabric B rectangle together in a row as shown. Press. Make two side pieced borders.



Step 10: Sew two B/C FG units together to form a diamond as shown. Press.

Step 11: Sew one B/C diamond, three B/C FG, three B/D FG, three B/E FG, three B/F FG, two B/G FG, and one 4-1/2" x 16-1/2" Fabric B rectangle together in a row as shown. Press. Make two top/bottom pieced borders.



^{*}Two B/G FG can be discarded.

Step 12: Sew the side pieced borders to the sides of the quilt center. Note the orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom middle borders to the quilt center. Again, note the placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Press toward the borders.

Step 8: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!



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
