Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

seventeen 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one-hundred and twenty-eight 3-1/2" squares

Sew the six remaining strips together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 48-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

two 3-1/2" x 54-1/2" side outer borders

thirteen 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two hundred forty-eight 2" squares. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square.

From each of Fabrics B, D, F, and H, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 3-1/2" squares one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut: twenty 2" squares

From each of Fabrics C, E, and G, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 3-1/2" squares one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut: sixteen 2" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Crossroad Blocks

Step 1: Place a 2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of a 3-1/2" Fabric B square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the lower left corner with another 2" Fabric A square.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 using all 2" Fabric A squares and 3-1/2" Fabric B-H squares.



Step 3: Gather four completed Step 2 units, all made from Fabric B. Arrange as shown, noting the orientation, and sew together to form a four-patch. Press the seams in opposite directions for the rows, then nest the seams and sew the two rows together. Press. The block should measure 6-1/2" square.



Step 4: Repeat Step 3 to make a total of:



Assemble the Diamond Blocks

Step 5: Place a 2" Fabric B square in the upper right corner of a 3-1/2" Fabric A square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press.



Step 6: Repeat Step 5 using all 2" Fabric B-H squares and 3-1/2" Fabric A squares.



Step 7: Gather four completed Step 6 units, all made from Fabric B. Arrange as shown, noting the orientation, and sew together to form a four-patch. Press the seams in opposite directions for the rows, then nest the seams and sew the two rows together. Press. The block should measure 6-1/2" square.



Step 8: Repeat Step 7 to make a total of:



five Fabric B Blocks



four Fabric C Blocks



five Fabric D Blocks



four Fabric E Blocks



five Fabric F Blocks



four Fabric G Blocks



five Fabric H Blocks

Assemble the Quilt


Step 9: Arrange the blocks into nine rows of seven blocks. Note the block and fabric placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 10: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 12: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
