Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

four 15-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

eight 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2" x 15-1/2" side block borders eight 2" x 18-1/2" top/bottom block borders

From Fabric C, cut:

ten 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 2" x 15-1/2" side outer block borders ten 2" x 18-1/2" top/bottom outer block borders

From Fabric D, cut:

four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 4" squares for the HSTs
nine 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
ten 2" x 12-1/2" side inner block borders
ten 2" x 15-1/2" top/bottom inner block borders

From each of Fabrics E and G, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 4" squares for the HSTs

From each of Fabrics F and I, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 4" squares for the HSTs

From Fabric H. cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 4" squares for the HSTs

From the Binding, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric D square with a 4" Fabric E square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty D/E HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat the process in Step 1 to make:










twelve D/F HSTs

twenty D/G HSTs

sixteen D/H HSTs

twelve D/I HSTs

Assemble the Blocks



Step 3: Gather: three D/G HSTs three D/H HSTs four D/E HSTs three D/F HSTs three D/I HSTs

Arrange the units into four rows of four. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 4: Sew the HSTs together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 5: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block center, measuring 12-1/2" square.

Step 6: Sew the Fabric D side inner block borders to the sides of the block center. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric D top and bottom inner block borders to the block center. Press toward the borders.

Step 7: Sew the Fabric C side outer block borders to the sides of the block center. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric C top and bottom outer block borders to the block center. Press toward the borders.

The Block should measure 18-1/2" square. Make four Blocks like this.



Step 8: Repeat the process in Steps 4-7, this time with: four D/E HSTs eight D/G HSTs four D/H HSTs

Make one Block like this.

Step 9: Sew the Fabric B side outer borders to the sides of the Fabric A squares. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric B top and bottom outer borders to the Fabric A squares. Press toward the borders. The resulting block should measure 18-1/2" square.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 10: Arrange the blocks into three rows of three blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 11: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 12: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
