

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

## From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 23-3/4" x 40-1/2" rectangle

#### From Fabric B, cut:

four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 40-1/2" side Border 1 strips

two 1-1/2" x 25-3/4" top/bottom Border 1 strips

## From Fabric C, cut:

three\* 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, then subcut:

two 2-7/8" x 42-1/2" side Border 2 strips

two 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 2-3/4" x 30-1/2" top/bottom Border 2 strips

\*Note: If your fabric measures 42", cut only two strips, then trim each strip to 42-1/2" long.

#### From Fabric D, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-eight 3" squares, then subcut:

each square once on the diagonal to yield seventy-six triangles

eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips

## From Fabric E, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-two 3" squares, then subcut:

each square once on the diagonal to yield eighty-four triangles

five 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, then subcut:

two 2" x 55-3/4" side Border 4 strips

two 2" x 41-3/4" top/bottom Border 4 strips

seven 1-1/2" x WOF strips

#### From Fabric F, cut:

six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, then subcut:

two 3-1/2" x 58-3/4" side Border 5 strips

two 3-1/2" x 47-3/4" top/bottom Border 5 strips

## From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Blocks

**Step 1:** Sew one 1-1/2" x WOF Fabric E strip between two 1-1/2" x WOF Fabric D strips. Press toward the darker fabric. Make three D/E/D strip sets



**Step 2:** Cut each strip set into 1-1/2" wide strip units. Each strip set will yield twenty-eight units and a total of eighty are needed.



**Step 3:** Sew one 1-1/2" x WOF Fabric D strip between two 1-1/2" x WOF Fabric E strips. Press toward the darker fabric. Make two E/D/E strip sets.



**Step 4:** Cut each strip set into 1-1/2" wide strip units. Each strip set will yield twenty-eight units and a total of forty are needed.




**Step 5**: Sew one E/D/E unit between two D/E/D units. Press. Make forty nine-patches.




**Step 6:** Sew one Fabric D triangle and one Fabric E triangle to two opposite edges of a nine-patch as shown. Press. Make forty units



**Step 7:** Sew two Fabric E triangles to the two remaining edges of a Step 6 unit. Press. Square the block to 4-3/4" if needed. Make four corner blocks.



**Step 8:** Sew one Fabric D triangle and one Fabric E triangle to two opposite edges of a Step 6 unit as shown. Press. Square the block to 4-3/4" if needed. Make thirty-six side blocks.



# Assemble the Pieced Border

**Step 9:** Sew eleven side blocks created in Step 8 together to form a row. Press. This is a side Border 3 unit. Repeat to make a second side Border 3 unit.



**Step 10:** Sew seven side blocks created in Step 8 together to form a row. Press. Sew a corner block from Step 7 to each end of the row. Press. This is the top pieced border. Repeat to make a second pieced border for the bottom.



# Assemble the Quilt

**Step 11:** Sew the side Border 1 strips to the sides of the Fabric A rectangle. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 1 strips to the Fabric A rectangle to create the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 12:** Sew the side Border 2 strips to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 2 strips to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 13:** Sew the side Border 3 units to the sides of the quilt center. Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for border orientation. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 3 units to the quilt center, again referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for orientation. Press toward the borders.

**Step 14:** Sew the side Border 4 strips to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 4 strips to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 15:** Sew the side Border 5 strips to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 5 strips to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
