

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 10-1/2" square
one 10-1/4" square
two 10-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eight 10-1/4" squares
eleven 6" x WOF strips. Subcut:
seventy-four 6" squares
three 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-one 5-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

one 6" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 6" squares two 5-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 5-7/8" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

two 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 6" squares one 5-7/8" square one 5-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 5-7/8" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

four 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 6" squares one 5-7/8" square one 5-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 5-7/8" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

three 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 6" squares one 5-7/8 square one 5-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 5-7/8" squares

From Fabric F, cut:

three 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighteen 6" squares one 5-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 5-7/8" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 6" Fabric A square with a 6" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 5-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:











Assemble the Flying Geese (FG)


Step 3: Pin two 5-7/8" Fabric B squares in opposing corners of a 10-1/4" Fabric A square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.




Step 4: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 5: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



Step 6: Place one 5-7/8" Fabric B square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



^{*}There is one extra A/F that can be discarded.

Step 7: Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 5-1/2" x 10-1/" if necessary. Repeat to make eight A/B FG units.



Step 8: Repeat with all remaining 10-1/4" Fabric A squares and 5-7/8" Fabric C-F squares to make a total of:


Assemble the Quilt

Step 9: Arrange the HSTs, FG units, and squares into fifteen rows of thirteen blocks. Note the fabric placement and orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 10: Sew the HSTs, FG units, and squares together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
