Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Note: Each column above shows one colorstory. The supplies given for each colorstory are enough for two complete Wreath Door Hangings.

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

### **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, fussy cut:

four 15" squares with a circular motif centered in each square

#### From Fabric B, cut:

on 2" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 2" x 20" rectangles

Note: The illustrations are only shown in the Holiday colorstory. The instructions are the same for both colorstories.

Step 1: Layer one 15" fussy cut square on top of one 16" square of batting. Quilt as desired.

Step 2: Cut the guilted square and one unguilted 15" fussy cut square into 14-1/2" circles with the circular motif still centered. Note: You can use something round with a 14-1/2" diameter as a template or use the template found on page 4. If you use the template included in the pattern, mark the center of the circle with a pin to align each quadrant of the circle to the same point.

Step 3: Fold one 2" x 20" Fabric B rectangle in half, lengthwise with right sides together. Sew along the long edge.

Step 4: Turn the long tube right side out, then press to complete the hanging strap.


Step 5: Alian the hanging strap to the edge of the guilted circle with about 4" in between the ends of the strap. Be sure the strap is not twisted. Baste the strap in place using a 1/8" seam allowance.

**Step 6:** Lay the unquilted circle on top of the guilted circle and tuck the strap toward the center. Pin the layers together, then sew around the perimeter. Leave a 3" opening at the bottom of the circle.

**Step 7:** Turn the circle right side out, then press. Topstitch around the edge of the circle to finish the wreath door hanging.


Step 8: Repeat Steps 1-7 to make a second wreath door hanging from the remaining cut pieces.




